

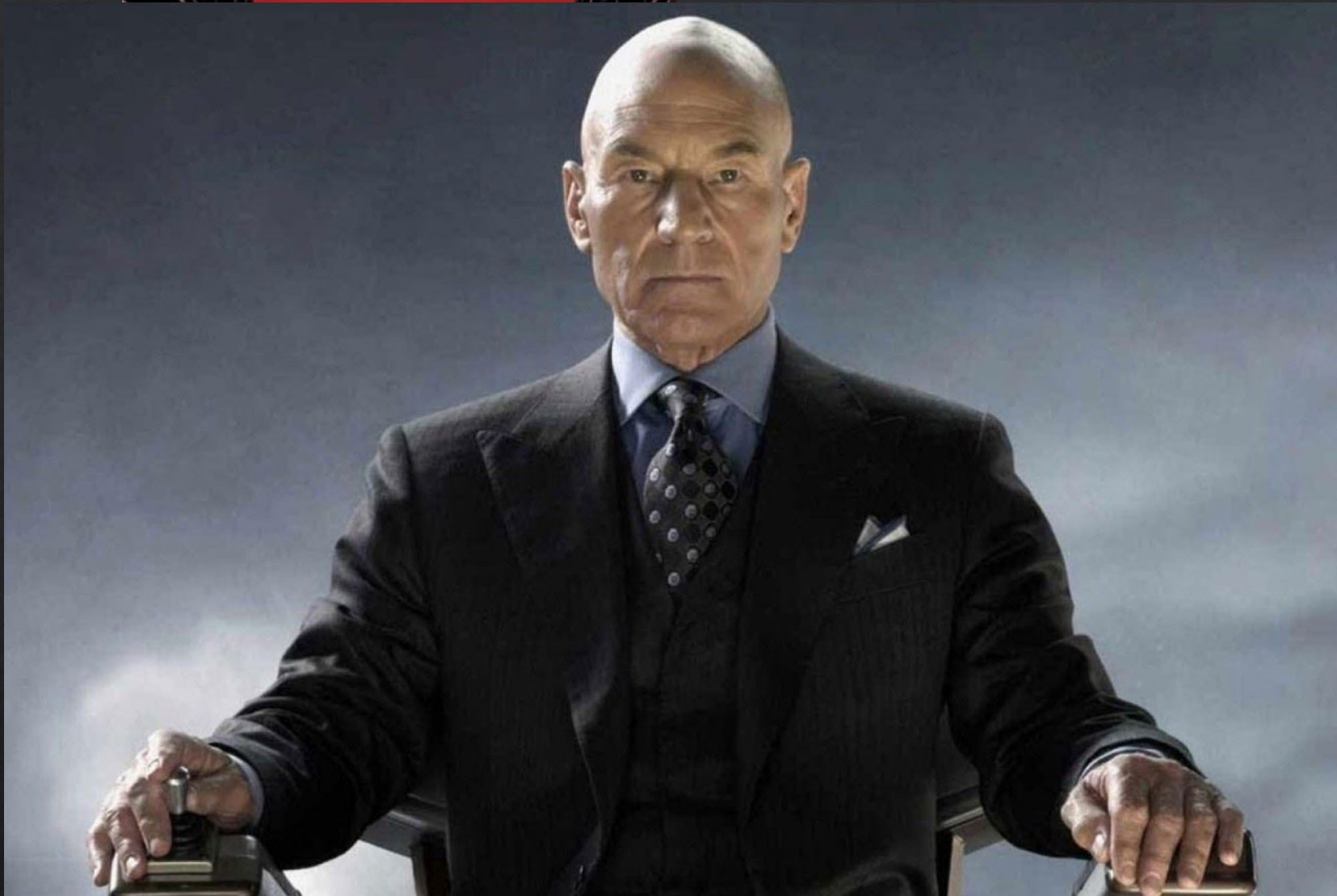

What is Zotero?

- ◇ Core Use: Research and Bibliography Manager
- ◇ Open-Source Tool – Managed by Corporation for Digital Scholarship: <https://digitalscholar.org/>
- ◇ Zotero lets you track and manage books, articles, web sites, and other documents.

Why/When could *you* use Zotero?

- ◆ Grant proposal research
- ◆ Any sort of report where you need to cite external sources
- ◆ Helping a patron with their own research
- ◆ Putting together a bibliography
- ◆ A bookmark manager and annotation tool

The Three S's of Zotero

Store

- Zotero stores documents and metadata.
- Books, Articles, Web Sites are the beginning.

Structure

- Collections and sub-collections act as folders.
- Documents have notes and tags which can all be searched.

Share

- Easy exports of reading lists.
- Zotero also has a limited storage feature which can act as a repository shared files.
